<b>Minutes of the Parish Assembly Held in Grouville Parish Church on Tuesday, 19 March 2024 at 18:30</b>

<b>Open Meeting</b>	The Connétable opened the meeting and welcomed everyone present and pointed out the fire exits. He reminded everyone that the meeting would be recorded to assist accurate minute taking, and that recording would be deleted once the minutes have been approved at a subsequent Parish Assembly.
<b>1. To receive and if deemed advisable approve the Minutes of the Parish Assembly held on 19 February 2024.</b>	The Connétable asked for any amendments or queries on the minutes of the Parish Assembly held on 19 February 2024. Mr John O’Brien drew attention to item 2 of the minutes, where he was proposed and seconded by two parishioners. He subsequently received a letter from the Attorney General stating that he would not be permitted to be sworn in due to being an alleged disruptive influence. Mr O’Brien continued by adding that the Solicitor General had previously confirmed that there were no complaints against him on his record. Mr O’Brien asked the Connétable why he was unable to fulfil his nomination. The Connétable replied that acceptance of nominations is made only through the Attorney General’s office and it is ultimately his opinion that carries, rather than that of the Parish. The Connétable then asked Mr O’Brien if he was contesting the minutes as that was the agenda item, to which Mr O’Brien replied he was not.  The minutes were proposed by Drew Livingston and seconded by Tracy Laurent.
<b>2. To elect one Constable’s Officer for each of the Vingtaines of De Longueville and De La Rocque</b>	The Connétable asked for nominations for the role of Constable’s Officer for the Vingtaine De Longueville. There were no nominations.  The Connétable asked for nominations for the role of Constable’s Officer for the Vingtaine De La Rocque.

	<p>Robert Le Brocq was proposed by Drew Livingston and seconded by Tracy Laurent.</p> <p>Mr Livingston said Mr Le Brocq had already served a three year term and had proved to be a reliable officer. He added that Mr Le Brocq was a motorcycle rider, which had proved invaluable to the Parish in large events, none more so than the Visite Royale held in 2022, which saw Mr Le Brocq carry out a sterling job by manning a multitude of check points throughout the Parish.</p> <p>With no further nominations, the Connétable declared Mr Le Brocq duly elected.
